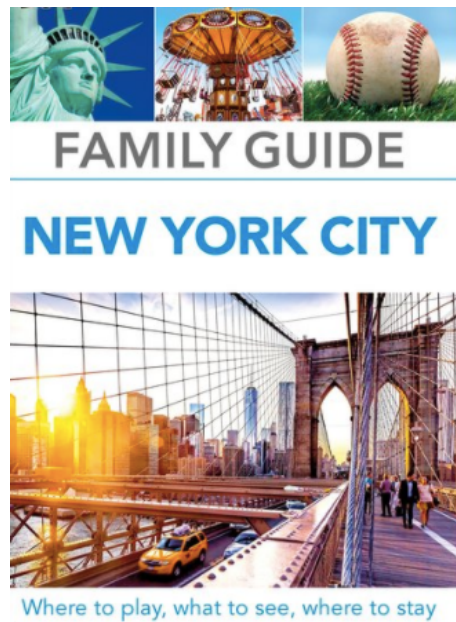
Holiday Brochure

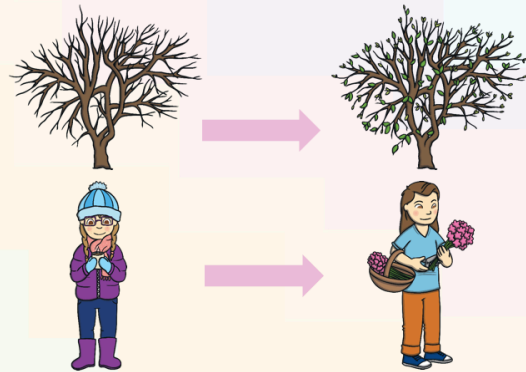

What Is Holi Festival?

- Holi originated in north India.
- Holi is a Hindu festival which celebrates the coming of spring.
- Holi is a time to give thanks for the harvested crops, which have grown in the winter.
- Holi is celebrated in March.
