Today we are going to complete our first lesson on Equivalent Fractions.

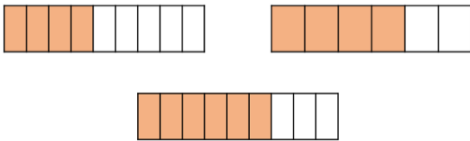
Look at the problem below:

$$\frac{6}{9}$$

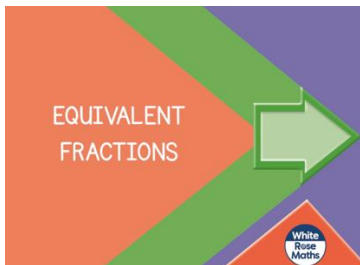
$$\frac{4}{6}$$
