Look at the following sentences:

1. *The house said, "I am so exhausted."*
2. *The house said it was exhausted.*

Can you explain the difference?

**Direct speech** - when the exact words that have been said by a person are written down inside inverted commas (speech marks)

**Indirect (reported speech)** - The main points of what someone has said is shared, without writing exactly what they said.

Which sentence is which?

1. *The house said, "I am so exhausted."* - *Direct Speech*
2. *The house said it was exhausted.* - *Indirect Speech*

Now watch the film up to 6.18 - when they leave the car manufacturing warehouse.

Q - Where did we first see the Old House?

## Maths

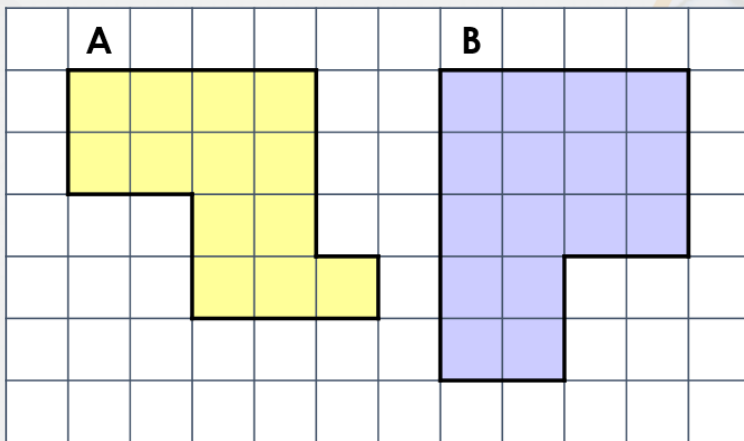
Starter Activity: Spend 10 - 15 minutes practising your times tables using TTRockstars or the practise sheets on the website.
