Lovely Literacy

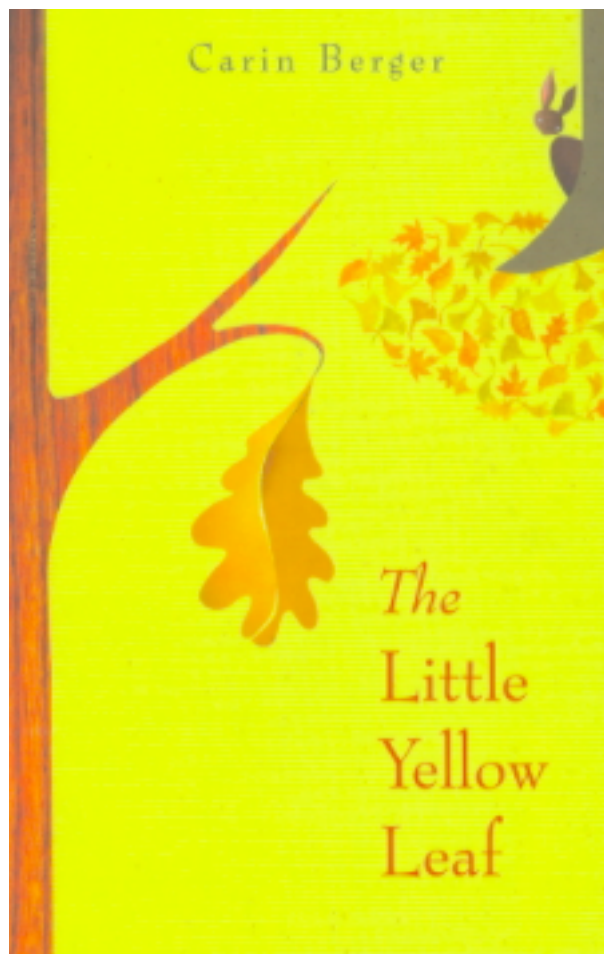
Reading

Year 2 and 3 - Make sure you read every day for about 20 mins. This can be anything that interests you or a book you've already read.

Writing Year 2 and 3

This week we are going to complete a unit using the book - *The Little Yellow Leaf* by Carin Berger.

This is a lovely story about facing the unknown and we thought it would be a lovely book for those of you that might be worried about the changes in September.



Lesson 1:

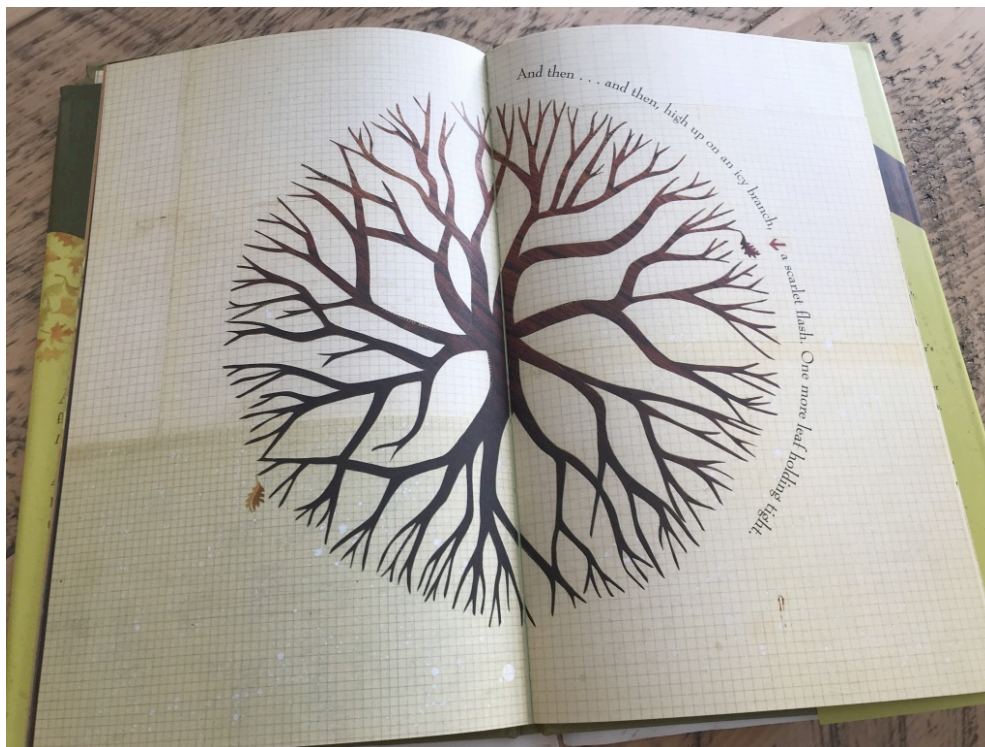
Watch and read along with Mrs Evans on the video blog.

What do you like about the story?

How do you think the little leaf is feeling at this stage of the story?



What about now?



What do you think about the ending? What do you think the moral of the story is?

1. The back of the book has no blurb. Could you write a blurb for the book?

Lesson 2:

You are all going to experience some change next year. It may be a new teacher, or a new classroom. No doubt all of you have a worry or two about moving on.

Imagine you are the little yellow leaf. What are you worried about that might stop you wanting to let go?

Write your worry on one side of a leaf (in resources)

Now write one thing you are looking forward to on the other side.

Decorate your leaf in any way you like so that we can display them at school. You could either post your leaf or bring it to school on the first day of term.

Lesson 3:

One of the loveliest things about this story are the illustrations. They are collage like pictures where other pictures or texts have been used to create new illustrations. Could you create a picture of you and your friends at school using this style? Like the one below.
