

After class 5G and class 6K had done their sponsored swim, they put their results into a bar chart. Miss Sterry asked class 6K to talk about what it showed.

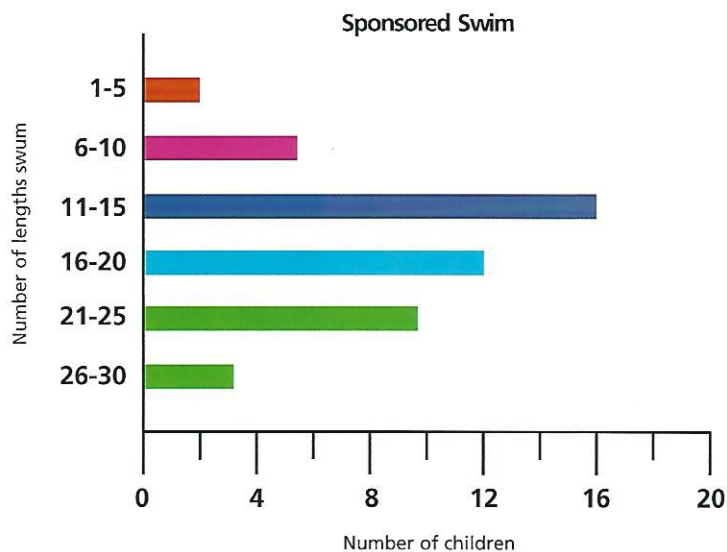
Kai said, '49 children took part in the swim.'
