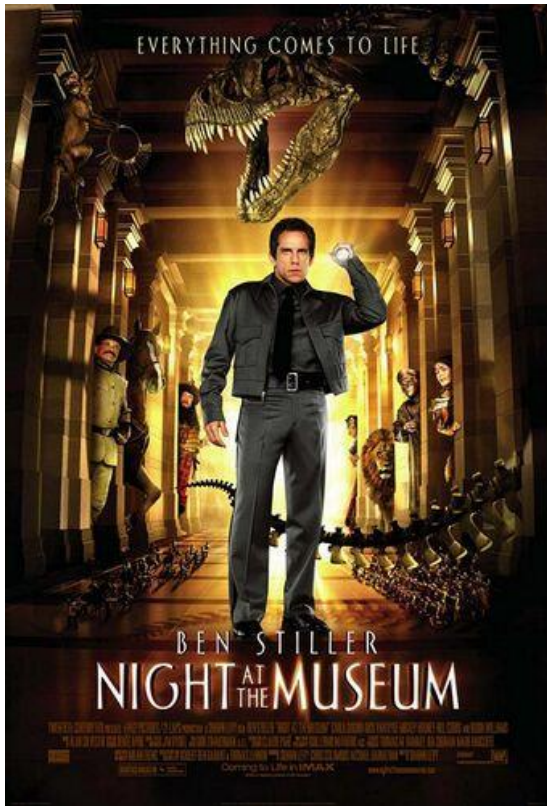

### Some ideas for Literacy activities:

- Watch a night at the museum. Can you write a letter as a character from the film? Could you write your own version based in one of the museums above?
- Can you write a rhyiming poem about your favourite piece of ART?
- Write a biography for Van Gogh or another famous person you are inspired by.
- Write a museum quiz for your family including some of the interesting facts you found out! You could include some distanced family on Zoom!
- Create a poster advertising the museums virtual tour.
- Review the museums virtual tour - trip advisor / VLOG / BLOG post.

Included on the class page is a Literacy unit called 'Alive!'. This includes writing activities based on a painting...very exciting!

### Some ideas for Topic activities:

- Recreate your favourite piece of ART seen in one of the museums. This could be 3D, modern art, a classic painting; whatever inspires you.
- Research Van Gogh or another famous person - What was their life like?
- Create your own Art gallery or family museum. This could be a model, map, collection of 'artefacts' etc...
- Research an animal (current or extinct) producing a poster about them. This could include diet, habitat, behaviour, fascinating facts etc...
- Research a point in history which interests or inspires you from the virtual tour.
