



PRIMARY PE AND SPORTS PREMIUM 2022/23

This funding has been provided to ensure impact against the following OBJECTIVE:

To achieve sustainable improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.

It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

The amount allocated for Buriton Primary School for the academic year 2022/23 is £16,891.
