Remote Education Provision January 2022

If children are required to self-isolate because a member of their household has tested positive for coronavirus, we will provide home learning activities for that child. This will be emailed to their parents.

However, there may be exceptional circumstances in which some level of restriction to education is required in a local area. In those situations, we aim to continue your child's education by providing home learning that continues the learning done in school.

In the unfortunate event of a partial or full school closure, as enforced by the Department for Education or the Health Protection Team, we will;

- Provide remote education for all pupils or, when possible provide printed resources, such as textbooks and workbooks, for pupils who don't have suitable online access.
- Provide a small number of laptops that may be loaned to pupils if their household does not have the resources to access the remote learning.

Teachers will;

- Plan a programme that's of equivalent length to the core teaching pupils would receive in school. This will be accessible from the 'children tab', then 'class pages' on the school website www.buriton.hants.sch.uk
- Be available every morning for a live virtual Zoom meeting with each class to discuss the learning for the day and answer any questions about it. (See Zoom protocol and times below).
- Be available every afternoon, at the end of the school day for a live virtual meeting with each class to discuss how the learning went that day.
- Set assignments so that pupils have work each day in a number of different subjects, and monitor pupils' engagement with these assignments.
- Prepare video resources to be available for children to access from the video centre or from a link on the school website <https://buriton-primary-school.primarysite.media/> to support their home learning.
- Set work that can be emailed back to the teacher **or** be uploaded onto the school blog <https://buriton-primary-school.primarysite.blog/>
- Give feedback on the work either face to face via virtual meetings or on the blog.

- Teach a planned and sequenced curriculum so that knowledge and skills are built incrementally, with clarity about what's intended to be taught and practised in each subject.
- Provide frequent explanations of new content, which may include signposting to online resources and/or videos.
- Adjust the pace or difficulty of what's being taught in response to questions or assessments, including, where necessary, revising material or simplifying explanations to ensure pupils' understanding.
- Be available to contact by parents via email so that queries can be addressed.

If Vulnerable and keyworker pupils are allowed in school, we will;

- Work with our local authority (LA) and follow guidance from the Health Protection Team
- Ensure these children have access to the remote learning in school and complete the tasks set for their class.

Zoom protocol for children

- Children must always have an adult in the room.
- Appropriate clothing must be worn.
- Be polite and respectful at all times – all meetings will be recorded.
- Do not publicise the meeting's link on social media.
- Do not take a screen shot of everyone.
- Wait your turn to speak, as it is difficult to hear what is being said if more than one person speaks, so raise your hand.
