Learning Overview: Summer Term 2026

Dear Parents,

Welcome to the Summer Term. We have had a great start to the term and are carefully watching the growth of our class caterpillars! All of the Diamond Team are so proud of the effort and progress that your children are making.

Reading

Tortoise Words: please continue to support your child to learn these words. If they have learnt how to read all 30, please encourage your child to learn how to spell them.

Reading Diary: Please ensure that you date and sign the reading diary so that we can monitor how frequently children are reading at home and whether they have read the books and feel free to write a comment when you read with your child: daily reading support is invaluable. We ask that you keep your child's book in their book bag and bring it to school every day. Please note that children gain familiarity with new words through repeated practice, so reading books need to be read at least twice so that your child is able to read with fluency. Your child will continue to be given a book that compliments our phonics teaching alongside one that focuses on high frequency words. Those children who have completed phase 5 of our phonics programme, will not be given phonic based books but two from the alternative reading scheme. Both books will be changed once a week to allow your child to read them enough times to gain fluency.

Writing

This half term our literacy is closely linked to our topic "Out of the Egg". We are looking at fiction and non-fiction texts and at short animations as inspirations for our writing. The year 1s will be writing fact sheets, a diary and entry and their own stories and will be focussing on using basic punctuation, using adjectives in their writing and extending their sentences using 'and' or 'but'. They are also learning to spell common high frequency words. We are encouraging the year Rs to use their phonic knowledge to hear and write the sounds in words in order to write phrases and sentences.

Year R/1 Phonics

Please continue to practise phonics cards with your child every day.

Numeracy

This half term we will continue to practice counting forwards and backwards, and write our numerals correctly. The Year 1s will be learning to describe position and direction and will learn about and solve problems relating to length, height and time. They will build on their knowledge of division and will continue working with 1 and 2 digit numbers up to 100. They will continue to count in 2s, 5s and 10s and will be continuing to build their fluency skills by practising number bonds and number facts. Year R children will be continuing to practise their counting and subitising skills and will be doubling, sharing and grouping numbers. They will be exploring addition and subtraction and will be investigating shapes. They will also be exploring mapping and describing position.

NUMBOTS: please remind your children to access their account and spend 10 minutes a day, 5 times a week building their fluency skills.

Topic

Our topics this term are "Out of the Egg" and "Under the Sea". These topics are predominantly science and geography, but other curriculum areas will be linked to this particular theme where appropriate. This half term we will be learning about plants and life cycles and next term, the names and features of different underwater creatures and we will also look at their different structures. In Geography, the children will be learning about the five oceans of the world, the different layers and the animals that live there. During our Art and DT sessions, the children will be doing observational drawings of butterflies and some collaborative work based on Eric Carle illustrations. They will be designing and making sea creature puppets and creating a corresponding scenery. In music, the children will be learning a variety of songs and using actions and instruments to enhance their performance.

P.E.:

P.E. lessons this term will be on Tuesday, Wednesday and every other Friday afternoon each week. Please send your child into school in their P.E. clothes **every** Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday. If your child wears earrings, please take them out for the P.E. days.

Water bottles and snacks:

Please could you continue to make sure that your child brings in a **named** bottle of **water every day**. Please be aware that other drinks, such as juice and squash, are not permitted. We would like to request that water bottles are not put in the book bags - a little leak goes a VERY long way. All children in our class continue to be able to have a free piece of fruit every day. If you wish to provide an extra snack please remember our school policy only allows fresh or dried fruit.

Miscellaneous extras:

As the weather (hopefully!) begins to improve, please provide your child with a named sun hat. Please also make sure that all long hair is ALWAYS tied back for health and safety reasons. By this point in the term some name labels have worn off so please check that all of your child's clothing is still named. It is an impossible task to reunite children with their clothes if they are not named!
